Working with 26 children and teens, plus their teachers and caregivers


- Children and teens are between ages 5 and

Highlights of the program: identifying unspoken feelings, and providing a safe space to express them:




"Outside feelings"

Adults working with or "parenting" these children and teens see positive changes in almost all of these brave youngsters who have lost so much during the war in Ukraine and their migration to Romania.


